# FROM "RABBI" JASON MARK

We currently find ourselves in Omer period, which spans the seven weeks between Passover and Shavuot. It is traditional during this time period to count the days each and every night leading up to Shavuot.

The origins and reasons for this counting are pretty unclear in the Torah. Yet the Hasidic Rabbis offer a unique metaphor to explain our Omer count:

A person finds a chest full of gold coins, takes it home, and then proceeds to count them. His counting has no effect on the actual number of coins in his possession; he now has no more and no less than he had before he counted them. But counting them makes them real to him; he can now digest the significance of his find and deliberate how to make use of it.

Our Redemption from Egypt was like receiving a massive treasure, and was in many ways overwhelming. In a span of just a few days, we went from lowly slaves to free people who had just a few weeks to prepare for the receiving of the Torah at Sinai.

The counting of the Omer was, therefore, offered as a tool to help them digest and integrate the amazing events of the Exodus into their lives. We were instructed to count every day so that we can make every day of this new life count.

As we move through this period of preparation before Sinai, may we take daily moments to reflect on how we can more fully integrate the blessings of our life, the incredible joys and possibilities of spiritual growth that come with this season of freedom and redemption.

# SHAVUOT YIZKOR SERVICES

Shavuot falls seven weeks after Passover at the end of the counting of the Omer and celebrates the giving of the Torah on Mount Sinai. The giving of the Torah was a far-reaching spiritual event—one that touched the essence of the Jewish soul for all times. Our sages have compared it to a wedding between G-d and the Jewish people. *Shavuot* also means "oaths," for on this day G-d swore eternal devotion to us, and we in turn pledged everlasting loyalty to Him. Shavuot is also the celebration of the wheat harvest and the ripening of the first fruits. It is customary to eat dairy foods on Shavuot. Menus range from traditional cheese blintzes to quiches, casseroles and more.

This year Shavuot begins on Saturday evening, June 4 and ends on Monday evening, June 6. It is traditional to recite the Yizkor Service on the second day. Please join us for a Shavuot Mincha Service followed by a Yizkor Service on Monday afternoon, June 6 at 5:30 p.m. at Etz Chayim. Services will be led by Charles Wittenberg.



TISHA B'AV

Tisha B'Av, the Fast of the Ninth of Av, is a day of mourning to commemorate the many tragedies that have befallen the Jewish people, many of which have occurred on the ninth of Av. Tisha B'Av means "the ninth (day) of Av". This year it falls on Thursday evening/Friday, August 4th & 5th, 2022.

Although this holiday is primarily meant to commemorate the destruction of the Temple, it is appropriate to consider on this day the many other tragedies of the Jewish people, many of which

occurred on this day, most notably the expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492 and from England in 1290.

Tisha B'Av is the culmination of a three week period of increasing mourning, beginning with the fast of the 17th of Tammuz, which commemorates the first breach in the walls of Jerusalem, before the First Temple was destroyed. During this three week period, weddings and other parties are not permitted, and people refrain from cutting their hair. From the first to the ninth of Av, it is customary to refrain from eating meat or drinking wine (except on the Shabbat) and from wearing new clothing.

The restrictions on Tisha B'Av are similar to those on Yom Kippur: to refrain from eating and drinking (even water); washing, bathing, shaving or wearing cosmetics; wearing leather shoes; engaging in sexual relations; and studying Torah. Work in the ordinary sense of the work (rather than the Shabbat sense) is also restricted. People who are ill need not fast on this day. Many of the traditional mourning practices are observed: people refrain from smiles, laughter and idle conversation, and sit on low stools.

In the synagogue, the book of Lamentations is read and mourning prayers are recited. Tisha B'Av is never observed on Shabbat. If the 9th of Av falls on a Saturday, the fast is postponed until the 10th of Av.
