A Message from the
PRESIDENT



Dear Congregant,

What a joyful Shabbat we celebrated last month. It wasn't just the Chinese food imported from Detroit for Shabbat dinner— although that didn't hurt – nor was it the sloppy joes that warmed our innards at Saturday lunch – although they really did warm our innards. It was the togetherness we felt as Rabbi Jason Mark led us through Kabbalat Shabbat services and Shabbat morning services, all in the chapel, pews filled, with a mechitzah down the middle of the room. Sitting closely together, we felt the warmth, the joy and the spirit of Shabbat. The rabbi spoke about hope and how, even when things may not be going the way one wants, it is important to find hope, especially on Shabbat. Rabbi Mark brings us that hope with his presence, his teaching, and the opportunity his presence allows to all of us to celebrate Shabbat together with our shul family.

Earlier in the month, Rivka Fridman embraced us at a Fireside chat as she guided us to recognize the presence of G-d beyond the happiest times and saddest times. Instead of the extremes, Rivka talked about the holiness of rudimentary things, like the systems inside of our bodies, and how extraordinary they and their workings are. She helped us explore how giving recognition and thanks for those miracles that we usually take for granted will bring us to a new level of spirituality.

Finally, we had the privilege of learning with our longtime friend and teacher, Aviva Panush, at a zoom session dedicated to Tu B'shevat. Through the texts that Aviva carefully selected, she opened our eyes and our hearts to various interpretations and understandings, connecting each of us where we found it easiest to connect. All of the texts were poetic, but one that exemplified, simply, the importance of our responsibility to take care of our (G-d's) world was from Avot d'Rebbe Natan, Rabbi Yohanan Ben Zakai used to say: "If you have a sapling in your hand and they tell you 'The Messiah is coming!' first plant the sapling and then go to greet him."

Today, as I write this article, many of our members, together, are looking forward to enjoying a performance of South Pacific as it debuts for Toledo Opera audiences in a new production at the Valentine Theater this weekend.

UPDATE FROM THE ETZ CHAYIM FUTURE COMMITTEE

Last March a Congregational meeting was held to discuss the results of the Shul Survey. The vast majority of the respondents were in favor of Etz Chayim continuing as Toledo's orthodox synagogue.

The focus then turned to possible relocation of the shul. At no time was there discussion about any merger with any other Jewish institution. Since April 2023, the Future Committee has been in contact with Chabad, B'nai Israel, Temple Shomer Emunim and the Jewish Federation.

Members of the Committee met with representatives of B'nai Israel which included a tour of their building and discussion of possible available space. Members also met with Chabad and toured their building, discussing options for any type of possible relocation.

The Committee investigated the lower level of the Temple as space for relocation. An architect was commissioned to provide a drawing of possible usable space as well as an estimate of the cost.

Most recently, the Committee has worked with representatives of the Federation relating to the possible purchase of the Five Lakes Church on McCord Road. A space planner was hired to provide both the Federation and Etz Chayim with options relating to the usable interior space.

The next steps to be taken relate to further discussions between the Federation and Etz Chayim as to the "ownership structure" of the property and whether the purchase of the church property is feasible.

The Committee has not eliminated any specific option for relocation. Further, the recommendation to stay on Woodley Road has not been eliminated nor has the possibility of finding another location.

The Committee wants to ensure that all options for the Shul's future have been investigated and ultimately a formal recommendation will be made to the Board.

God's Hidden Call - A Thought about Purim

Following are excerpts from this article; it can be found in entirety online.

The Book of Esther . . . comes from an almost secularized world, where we search for the presence of God in history and we fail to find it. Yet there is one line in the *megillah* that cuts through me like a knife and represents the most powerful statement in Judaism I know that Hashem has not abandoned us.

Towards the end of the fourth chapter, we find Esther telling her uncle Mordechai about all the problems there might be in interceding with King Achashverosh regarding the fate of the Jewish people. Mordechai listens and then responds to her with the famous words, *Im haharash tachrishi, ba'et hazot revach v'hatzla ya'amod layehudim mimakom acher*, "If you are silent and you do nothing at this time somebody else will save the Jewish people." *U'mi yodeia im l'et kazot, higa'at lamalchut?* "But who knows, was it not for just this moment that you became a Queen, with access to King Achashverosh in the royal palace?"

This, for me, is the ultimate statement of *hashgacha pratit*, that wherever we are, sometimes Hashem is asking us to realize why He put us here, with these gifts, at this time, with these dangers, in this place. *Hashgacha pratit* is our fundamental belief that God never abandons us, that He puts us here with something to do. Even in the worst hiding of God, if you listen hard enough, you can hear Him calling to us as individuals, saying *U'mi yodeia im l'et kazot higa'at lamalchut?* "Was is not for this very challenge that you are here in this place at this time?"

In the third chapter of *Hilchot Teshuva, The Laws of Repentance*, Rambam teaches us how throughout the entire year, we should see ourselves as if we as individuals and the entire world collectively are evenly poised between merit and sin. Our next deed may tilt the balance of our life, it may tilt the balance of somebody else's life, it may even tilt the balance of the world. We never know when an act of ours will have consequences. Did Esther, growing up with Mordechai, know that one day, the entire future of the Jewish people will rest with her? You never know what significance one friendship or one little moment might have for you and for somebody else that might just change the world.

You don't have to change the world to change the world. Let me explain. If we really believe, as the Mishna in Sandedrin, says *Nefesh achat k'olam malei*, that "A life is like a universe" then if you change one life, you can begin to change the universe the only way any of us can, one life at a time, one day at a time, one act at a time.
