Dear Congregant,

What is viability? Many definitions, but essentially, able to function independently.

I recently heard, second hand, that a leader in our community indicated that Etz Chayim is not a viable congregation. After my initial flare of anger, I gave it some thought.

I thought about the seventeen challahs that our Sisterhood delivered last month for May birthdays and about our May weekend, with Rabbi Mark, starting with a dinner of 29 and yes, a smaller, but dedicated Saturday minyan. I reflected on our pre-Pesach program with Aviva Panush, a respected scholar and beloved teacher from Ann Arbor, and other Sunday and Wednesday morning programs with films and speakers that bring together people from across our

community to explore a variety of topics; of the members and non-members who gather on Sunday mornings to play mahjong and poker; of our dedicated minyanaires, more than twenty of them, who make certain that we have a minyan every Wednesday night.

Does that indicate that we are not viable?

It is true that we are a congregation of seniors, proud and vibrant, energetic and capable. And yes, there are few if any of us who are Shomer Shabbos. Yet we value the presence of Orthodox Judaism in our community and are dedicated to holding on to that presence as long as we can. We treasure our precious legacy and what it represents. Ultimately, we have made a decision to remain viable as long as we can. And, we like each other. We enjoy being together, in prayer, in social settings, in learning situations. Yes, we like each other.

In *Genesis 18*, Abraham pleads with G-d to spare the city of Sodom and its neighboring city, Gomorrah, from impending destruction, a plan based on the wickedness in the cities. Abraham intercedes, asking G-d to spare destruction if a certain number of righteous people can be found. G-d agrees to 50, then 45, ultimately to 10, if 10 righteous people can be found, a demonstration that quantity is not valued in and of itself, but quality is what matters.

We are acutely aware that numbers matter, that once we cannot get a minyan, we cannot exist. At the same time, we know that we would like to stay together for as much of our natural lives as possible and are doing what we can to assure that possibility.

The Board of Etz Chayim and its Future Committee are demonstrating due diligence in exploring what our near future should be, what is best for us, for our perpetuity so long as we deem ourselves viable. We continue to examine the options before us. We were pleased that so many of our congregants attended the community meetings held last month, another demonstration of our viability.

There is a Talmudic adage, "We do not see things as *they* are, we see things as *we* are." We all look through different eyes. If we see ourselves as viable, so we are, regardless of what an outsider's eyes see. As we celebrate Shavuot, commemorating the giving of the Torah, may we find guidance and inspiration through its teachings, to have the serenity to accept the things we cannot change, the courage to change the things we can, and the wisdom to know the difference.

On behalf of the Officers and the Board of Trustees, I invite you to become a part of our viability, to attend a program, a dinner, a service; and we wish you and yours a *chag sameach*.

<u>SHAVUOT</u>



It is ironic that Shavuot is such a little-known holiday, given that it commemorates the single most important event in Jewish history – the giving of the Torah at Mount Sinai.

Shavuot occurs on the 6th of Sivan, the culmination of a seven-week period, "counting of the Omer," that occurs following Passover. The very name "Shavuot" means "weeks," in recognition of the weeks of preparation and anticipation leading up to the Sinai experience. Since Shavuot occurs 50 days after the first day of Passover, it is sometimes known as "Pentecost," a Greek word meaning

"the holiday of 50 days." (Shavuot, however, has no connection to the Christian Pentecost holiday.)

Three millennia ago, after leaving Egypt on the day of Passover, the Jews traveled into the Sinai desert. There, the entire Jewish nation – 3 million men, women and children – directly experienced divine revelation:

G-d spoke to you from the midst of the fire; you were hearing the sound of words, but you were not seeing a form, only a sound. He told you of His covenant, instructing you to keep the Ten Commandments, and He inscribed them on two stone tablets. (Deut. 4:12-13)

The giving of the Torah was an event of awesome proportions that indelibly stamped the Jewish nation with a unique character, faith and destiny. And in the 3,300 years since, the Torah's ideals – monotheism, justice, responsibility – have become the moral basis for Western civilization. In the words of U.S. President Calvin Coolidge, "The Hebraic mortars cemented the foundations of American democracy."

Shavuot this year begins at sundown on Sunday, June 1 and ends at nightfall on Tuesday, June 3.

TISHA B'AV

Tisha B'Av, the Fast of the Ninth of Av, is a day of mourning to commemorate the many tragedies that have befallen the Jewish people, many of which have occurred on the ninth of Av. Tisha B'Av means "the ninth (day) of Av". This year it falls on Sunday, August 3, 2025.

Although this holiday is primarily meant to commemorate the destruction of the Temple, it is appropriate to consider on this day the many other tragedies of the Jewish people, many of which occurred on this day, most notably the expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492 and from England in 1290.

Tisha B'Av is the culmination of a three week period of increasing mourning, beginning with the fast of the 17th of Tammuz, which commemorates the first breach in the walls of Jerusalem, before the First Temple was destroyed. During this three week period, weddings and other parties are not permitted, and people refrain from cutting their hair. From the first to the ninth of Av, it is customary to refrain from eating meat or drinking wine (except on the Shabbat) and from wearing new clothing.

The restrictions on Tisha B'Av are similar to those on Yom Kippur: to refrain from eating and drinking (even water); washing, bathing, shaving or wearing cosmetics; wearing leather shoes; engaging in sexual relations; and studying Torah. Work in the ordinary sense of the work (rather than the Shabbat sense) is also restricted. People who are ill need not fast on this day. Many of the traditional mourning practices are observed: people refrain from smiles, laughter and idle conversation, and sit on low stools.

In the synagogue, the Book of Lamentations is read and mourning prayers are recited. Tisha B'Av is never observed on Shabbat. If the 9th of Av falls on a Saturday, the fast is postponed until the 10th of Av.




