Andrea Delman, a life-long Glass City resident, has made her mark in the Jewish Community of Toledo as well as the general community. She, with her husband Gary, have been generous philanthropists throughout our community, not just in monetary gifts, but with their time, resourcefulness, and energy.

Andrea has participated in lay leadership positions within the Jewish Community for many years. Specifically, Andrea was deeply involved in the Toledo Board of Jewish Education, served as its president, and was one who was instrumental in the development of the Hebrew Academy Middle School. In the Federation, in Chabad, in every aspect of the community, she and Gary have been involved.

Art is a passion for Andrea, who studied to become a Docent at The Toledo Museum of Art where she served for a decade. There, she enjoyed giving tours with Jewish Community Groups and intertwining Jewish topics with the artwork. It was through those tours that Etz Chayim members were able to know Andrea, and appreciate her charm, her expertise, her love of art. For five years, beginning in 2020, Andrea collaborated with Naomi Baron to present a combination Zoom book club discussion and art relating to the themes of the book. Her programs have long been a favorite of our members.
